Choose your homework from the menu below:

The Peri-ometer suggests the difficulty or challenge the homework may offer. You must complete at least one task.



Create a learning resource that others can use to learn about where fabrics come from, properties of fabrics and suitable products that could be made from the fabrics.

This could be a poster, a leaflet, flashcards

Draw the structure of the three main methods of construction (woven, knitted, bonded) and explain what products could be made from them and why.

e.g Draw a woven pattern - name a garment made from woven yarns - explain why weaving is suitable for that garment.

Find 10 fabric items in your house; write the product, fabric and the properties of that fabric that make it suitable.

E.g Carpet - made from aramid fibres - To make it strong and flame resistant.

Create a mind map about where natural and synthetic fibres come from.

It should be eye catching and have detail, include fibres:

Silk, cotton, linen, jute, wool, cashmere, polyester, nylon, Acrylic, lycra.

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
